Our learning

Literacy

We were set a challenge by Vanessa Ruck, when she came to visit us a few weeks ago. Could we write her a biography? We have gathered information and then created questions to ask her to find out the information that was lacking. We will then be putting it all together next week to create a biography all about her.

Art

We are looking at architecture this half term and have been doing some observational drawings of the school, thinking carefully about scale, positioning and detail.



Maths

We have started to look at volume and using the different units of measure to estimate and work out the volume of different solids.

Our current RE unit is titled 'Are you Inspired?' We have explored the people that inspire us in our families, communities and the wider world and considered who Jesus inspires Christians to this day.

Our learning

Literacy

For the past 2-weeks, we have been learning how to write stories with dialogue. The children have been basing their stories on a short film called 'Wing', a story based on anti-bullying. The children have completed their own independent writes on a conversation between Wing and Winglet, they have written some effective and powerful pieces of writing, as they have been able to embody the characters through role play and drama.



Humanities

We have been focusing on our new History topic: Black & British. So far, the children have learnt that there have been black people living in Britain through much of history, all the way back to the Roman times. They became Historians and Archaeologists, as they looked at evidence such as pottery and art from the Roman times. We will carry on with this topic after the half-term before moving onto Victorians.

Maths

In Maths we have been completing SATs revision. The children have been working so hard in Maths and we hope that they have let their light shine in their SATs.





Art

The children are still focusing on Architecture in Art. From their observational drawings of different houses, as well as trying to recreate some of Zaha Hadid's designs, the children have now created their own dream houses!



Science


Over the last couple of weeks we have been finding out about the gestation period of animals compared to humans. We found out that the gestation period of a gorilla is 8.5 months, similar to that of a human. Did you know the gestation period of a goldfish is 2 to 7 days? We looked at patterns between the size of the animal and the gestation period and concluded that usually, the bigger the animal the longer the gestation period. We represented the data using bar charts.
