Our learning in Nursery

Topic – The Great Outdoors

So far this term, the children have been learning all about plants, following the book Rapunzel and learning how things grow. This week we have covered the story, The North Wind and The Sun learning about different weathers and increasing our language development around this. We still have minibeasts, pond life, hibernation and new life to cover in this broad topic about the The Great Outdoors. Next week we will focus on minibeasts, reading The Very Hungry Caterpillar.

Expressive Art and Design

Our artist this term is Claude Monet, this children have already painted their interpretation of his famous works 'The Gardens of Giverny'. During our pond life topic, we will be looking at his, 'Waterlillies' painiting and making a collaborative water colour masterpiece. Our role play has been a garden centre this term, we will continue to build upon this throughout term thinking about the things we might see on a garden centre visit.

STEM

In science we have been doing some weather experiments, thinking where rain comes from and making our own clouds. In maths we have been looking at number bonds from 1-5 using a rainbow pattern to help us think about the different ways to make 5. Next week we will be learning about symmetry and patterns in nature.

Understanding The World

We got our garden Spring ready by planting some bulbs and weeding. We also delivered some bulbs to our community to think about the people that live around school and how they support us. We will be learning all about life cycles and using crafts and practical opportunities to cement this learning. We will also be visiting the Tiggywinkles centre to learn about the animals that live around us and how to care of them.

Literacy

Each week we focus on a different book. This term we have had a range of fiction and non fiction texts. We started the term with 'Mr Wolfs Pancakes' where the children learnt the order of a recipe and then finished the week with writing their own recipes for pancakes. We also made our own pancakes following the recipe! We moved onto our traditional tale of the term, 'Sleeping Beauty'. The children explored some wonderful describing words for the enchanted forest that grew around the castle. We are progressing onto more sentence writing and becoming more independent using our Fred Fingers to spell.

Maths

We have been looking at comparing quantities this term, using the stem sentences

_____ has more than _____ has fewer than

We have been looking at the number pattern from 1 to 8. We have been focussing on 2 is one more than 1 and so on. However, this week we have been looking at ALL the numbers that each number is bigger than. E.g. 7 is bigger than 6, 7 is bigger than 2, 4 is bigger than 1. We will now be exploring the different ways we can make 7 and 8 so help build our understanding of number bonds to 10.

Topic

What a lovely start to our half term by making pancakes! We had fun with our very own pancake races too. It was also lovely to see the chinese lanterns the children made before half term, were used to decorate the lunch hall when we had a special Chinese New Year feast last Friday.

This week we have been looking at the work of the artist Steven Brown, We tried using some oil paints and a palette knife and made our own McCoo picture. Ash and Alder class worked together to produce a beautiful butterfly in the style of Steven Brown to display in our cloakroom.
